Now in its fourth year since created by the Archbishops of Canterbury and of York, Thy Kingdom come invites you to join in a season of prayer over the 11 days between Ascension and Pentecost.



This observes an ancient tradition based on the disciples gathering 'constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus ... 'after Jesus had ascended into heaven.

What started with a few people has now become a global wave of prayer embracing churches of many denominations and different traditions both around the UK and across the world.

In Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire leaders from the Methodist Church, Baptist Church, the Free churches, the Roman Catholic Church, Pentecostal churches and several of the Eastern and Oriental Orthodox churches in the UK as well as the Church of England have all signalled their support.
